I have a Vow: To lead all who stray away from the straight path again into goodness and save them.


I am attached to a Work that I love: To remove the sufferings of the poor and grant them what they lack.

I will not give up My Mission, nor My Determination.
I know I will carry them out.





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

There are many Trusts functioning under the name of 'Sri Sathya Sai Trust (Name of the state)'. In six of these Trusts functioning in the states of Bihar, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Haryana & Chandigarh, Andhra Pradesh and Karnataka, the Central Trust has powers to nominate the trustees. In all the other State Trusts, new trustees are appointed by the existing trustees. There are some Sai Trusts and Foundations functioning overseas which are independent bodies and the Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust has no legal connection with them though all are connected through the Divine inspiration of Bhagawan Baba.

All contributions to the Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust are voluntary from individuals who witness Bhagawan Baba's various projects being executed efficiently, their positive impact on beneficiaries and their providing relief to a large number of people. Report of Activities 2019-20

The year under review was the 94th year of the advent of Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba. The celebrations were held throughout the year, not only at Prasanthi Nilayam, but all over India and in many countries around the world. In the week leading up to Bhagavan's birthday that is celebrated on 23rd November every year, devotees along with youth groups from many countries gathered at Prasanthi Nilayam for the occasion.

The Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust (SSSCT) is a unique institution. It is a public charitable Trust whose objectives are service to the needy, through activities in the fields of health, education and public utility. Bhagavan has set up landmark institutions and projects with very innovative models for efficient functioning and effective utilisation of resources. The Trustees have been ensuring that these continue to work in the same efficient manner, in the same spirit of inspiration and dedication.

There were 10 Board meetings (Board of Trustees - 4 and Board of Management - 6) between 1st April 2019 and 31st March 2020.

- Golden Jubilee of Brindavan campus, SSSIHL at Bengaluru was celebrated on 9th June 2019. Sri M Venkaiah Naidu, Honourable Vice President of India was the Chief Guest.
- International Ladies Day was celebrated on 19th November 2019. Dr. Tamilisai Soundararajan, Hon'ble Governor of Telangana was the Chief Guest.
- 94th Birthday celebrations of Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba was celebrated on 23rd November 2019.
 Shri Nitin Gadkariji, Hon'ble Minister, Ministry of Road Transport & Highways, Govt of India was the Chief Guest.
- New website of the Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust
 www.srisathyasai.org was launched on the occasion of Bhagavan's 94th Birthday on 23rd November 2019.
- The Trust approved a Multimedia Museum at Brindavan, Bengaluru on the life and teachings of Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba at a cost of Rs.463 lakhs
- The Trust spent Rs.430 lakhs for the ongoing construction of the Convention Centre at Prasanthi Nilayam.

- As part of Phase 3 of the ongoing solar power project, an additional solar plant of 1.3 MWp capacity was set up for the SSSIHMS-PSG, at a financial outlay Rs.6.6 Crores.
- Approved the construction of Ground Level Storage Reservoir (GLBR) and overhead water storage reservoir (OHSR) at Prasanthi Nilayam, at an estimated cost of Rs.105 Lakhs,
- Rain water harvesting initiative taken up at Prasanthi Nilayam and Brindavan which will result in increase of water yield
- Modernisation of Sri Sathya Sai Media Centre facilities initiated
- Approved construction of Workers Quarters at Anantapur Campus of SSSIHL at an estimated cost of Rs.72.5 Lakhs
- The Trust gives highest priority for safety of visitors, residents and staff. Safety brochure manuals and guidelines circulated to all institutions with regular safety briefings and mock drills.
- Fire Protection System at Super Speciality hospital in Bengaluru, SSSIHMS-WFD was approved at a cost of ₹ 1.50 Crores.
- As part of its commitment to School education, the Trust approved Financial assistance to Sri Sathya Sai Gurukula Vidya Nikethan, Bejjanki (Telangana), Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Vihar, Palasa (Andhra Pradesh) and school run by Bhagawan Baba Mahila & Makkala Koota Trust, Mysuru (Karnataka)
- To make it convenient for devotees to follow the proceedings in the Sai Kulwant Hall, LED Screens were installed at a cost of Rs.85 lakhs.
- Various improvement works taken up at SSSIHL college campuses at Anantapur, Brindavan & Muddenahalli, at an estimated cost of Rs.79 lakhs.
- Renovation of washrooms at Ladies Sevadal Building & Sai Bhaktha Nivas, at a cost of Rs.90 lakhs, for convenience of visiting sevadal and the devotees.
- ₹ 138 Lakhs approved for the installation of 6 lifts in various residential blocks in Prasanthi Nilayam.
- The Trust approved the donation of Rs.50 lakhs to Sri Sathya Sai Trust, Andhra Pradesh for



construction of a building for Rural Vocational Training Centre (RVTC) at Tadipatri, Anantapur district.

- Renovation of two residential blocks (North Prasanthi blocks) was approved at a cost of ₹ 622 Lakhs.
- In light of increasing demand for accommodation, a new dormitory and a block with 225 rooms was approved at cost of about Rs.60 Crores.
- Exemptions to Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust by the Government of Andhra Pradesh were extended for a further period of 10 years from certain sections of Andhra Pradesh Charitable and Hindu Religious Institutions and Endowments Act, 1987.
- The Board of Trustees resolved to designate Trustee Sri R J Rathnakar, as Managing Trustee, who will be the Chief Functionary and Chief Executive of the Trust and will represent the Trust in all its affairs and dealings.



- The year 2020 has been a gargantuan ordeal with the Corona pandemic that has disrupted life and living like no other. However, as always, the Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust has risen to the occasion to come to aid of all those in need.
- Hon'ble Prime Minister Sri Narendra Modi ji held a video conference with representatives of social welfare organizations as nation was facing an unprecedented crisis due to Covid-19, needing the service of these organizations and their resources like never before. Shri Rathnakar, Managing Trustee of Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust was part of the video conference along with Shri Nimish Pandya, All India President of Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisation.




- The Trust setup one of the first private Quarantine Centres in the district on 26th March, 2020 at SSSIHMS-Prasanthigram

- Contributed Rs. FIVE CRORES to the "Chief Minister Relief Fund, Andhra Pradesh".




Shri Nitin Gadkariji along with the Trustees of SSSCT releasing the Annual Report 2018-19

Compliance & Social Impact

Compliance: Our books of accounts are regularly audited by an eminent firm of auditors. Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust has consistently adhered to procedures of regulatory compliance required by various departments of the government. The Trust files income tax returns every year and responds promptly to any follow-up queries by the Income Tax Department. Reports required under Foreign Contribution Regulation Act, 1976 are regularly submitted to the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India. The Trust has been filing a copy of the annual financial statements along with this statement giving details of additions / deletions to the assets of the Trust, with the Assistant Commissioner of Endowments, Anantapur every year as per subsection 10 of section 43 of the Andhra Pradesh Charitable & Hindu Religious Institutions and Endowments Act, 1987. The Trust has been prompt and timely in its history of compliance.

Social Impact: In the last couple of years, Central Trust has installed rooftop solar power panels in a conscious move towards green sources of power. These solar panels have been installed at the two super-speciality hospitals, the hostels of the educational institutions in Prasathi Nilayam campus, and on various building in the ashram. During this year, Central Trust has installed 2395 kwp at a cost of ₹ 10.5 crores.

The Central Trust has been offering free medical care to the needy through two General Hospitals and two Super-speciality Hospitals. The Trust also runs, as part of the medical outreach program, a Mobile Hospital. During the current year, the benefit to society through medical costs saved by patients treated at the two Super-speciality Hospitals is estimated at ₹ 153.4 Crores (computed at CGHS rates), and since inception the amount is a staggering ₹ 2,664.2 Crores. If the market cost of treatment at hospitals of comparable level of sophistication in equipment and medical services were to be considered, the savings realized would be far higher than these figures.

Similarly, the Central Trust runs educational institutions from primary and secondary levels to undergraduate and post graduate courses and Ph.D. degrees, providing contemporary and quality academic programs with value orientation. This again is totally free to the students. The total number of students studying in all these institutions together is 3,744 (2,368 in schools and 1,376 in University).



Solar Power Plants

The Trust has taken huge initiatives in the last few years towards powering the Institutions through Solar Power moving away from conventional energy sources through the Sri Sathya Sai Mitra project. So far the installed capacity of 2.1MWp has in FY 2019-20 generated 32.6 lakh units which is 14% more than the designed capacity while leading to savings of Rs. 2.42 Crores in that period.

Under Phase 2 of the project 86 solar power plants for capacity of 2.7MWp was envisioned of which 77 plants with capacity 2.4 MWp have already been commissioned in FY 2019-20.

In FY 2020-21 Phase 3 of the project adding a 1.3MWp plant at Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Medical Sciences, Prasanthigram will be undertaken, taking the total installed capacity to 6.3MW.

Solar-cum-heat pump based water heating systems have been installed in the students' hostels at the Brindavan (Bengaluru) and Anantapur campuses of Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Learning.

Water Conservation Measures

The water conservation efforts through rain water harvesting measures have borne fruit as the bore wells have got recharged leading to increase in the levels of water table. Sewage Treatment Plants are already being used to reduce use of fresh water for gardening.

Other Major Projects

- Construction of a new Convention Centre spread 50,000 sq ft consisting of 2 auditoria, with seating capacities of 300 and 1000 respectively and 2 conference halls is in progress.
- Sri Sathya Sai Educational Institution for Women, Dharwad: In the first and second phase 9 Crores had been spent on construction of school, college and hostel campuses. During the year the hostel was augmented with additional floor area of 10000sft and the school with additional area of around 20000sft. A sports arena of around 5500sft was also built at the campus.
- A Museum based on the life and teachings of Bhagawan Baba is being set up at Brindavan (Bengaluru)
- Renovation of residential blocks in the North sector of Prasanthi Nilayam is underway including provision of lifts in these buildings.

Introduction

In recent years, several advances have been made in the fields of Medical Sciences and Technology. While medical facilities have increased manifold, the prohibitive cost of quality healthcare (being highly capital and skill intensive) has taken many of these life saving measures out of the reach of the common man. In response to this situation, Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba set up hospitals to provide highest level of healthcare to all patients free of all charges.

The Sri Sathya Sai Hospitals perform thousands of advanced surgeries each year totally free of cost without any discrimination of caste, creed or economic status. Nearly 66% of the patients treated at the two super-speciality hospitals are those whose family annual income is less than Rs.30,000 p.a. In this way, they bring a smile to the faces of economically distressed section of the masses for whom access to quality healthcare would have otherwise remained a distant dream.



Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Medical Sciences, Prasanthigram

Placed in the heart of an arid and rural region, this 300 bed Super Speciality hospital continues to remain an oasis of hope for the poor and needy of this country who have been suffering from various diseases. In the past year, the hospital handled around 148,053 patient visits. A total of around 11,542 surgeries/procedures were performed during the year, in the departments of Cardiology, Cardio-thoracic vascular surgery, Urology, Ophthalmology, Orthopaedics, and Plastic Surgery. The post-graduate programme (DNB) has

once again produced stellar results with all candidates successfully clearing the extremely competitive national level examinations.

Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Medical Sciences, Whitefield (Bengaluru)

At once breath-taking in its architecture and inspiring in its mission of serving the poorest of the poor of this country, this 333 bed super-speciality hospital saw nearly 99,000 patients in its super-speciality departments of Cardiac Sciences and Neuro-Sciences performing more than 6700 surgeries/procedures in the year gone by.



On the academic front too, the hospital had lots to cheer. In recognition of the excellent instruction provided by the doctors of our hospital, National Board of Examinations has selected SSSIHMS, Whitefield as DNB Examination centre for both Cardiology, Cardiac Surgery and Anaesthesia. Dr. Kolli Chalam, HOD Anaesthesia, Dr Hiremath, HOD CTVS and Dr. Reeta HOD Cardiology have been enlisted as sought-after examiners for both DNB and DM examinations.

Conferences that were conducted during the year included (i) SACRED-23 (Congenital Cardiac Imaging) Sunday, 29-Dec-2019 (ii) "UPENN - SSSIHMS Cardiac MR Course" conducted in collaboration with University of Pennsylvania, United States between Mar 7 - 10, 2020 (iii) 5th Indo US Critical Care Medicine Update 2020: Department of Anaesthesiology and Critical Care Medicine, in collaboration with Baylor College of Medicine Texas; University of Texas, USA and also Indian society of critical care medicine on 6th and 7th January 2020.

A number of visiting teams of doctors conducted workshops in current sophisticated techniques in the fields of Cardiac and Neuro Sciences, while performing many critical surgeries/procedures and Doctors from the hospital have won several accolades at national and international levels for paper presentations at conferences.

Sri Sathya Sai General Hospital, Prasanthi Nilayam

This was the first medical institution set up by Bhagawan and is now a 125 bed hospital with 4 major departments. In FY 2019-20 more than 300,000 patients were treated which translates to nearly 1000 patients a day! About 367 major general surgeries were performed and the Obstetrics Department admitted nearly 1500 mothers for deliveries.

Some of the important additions to the medical services being offered this year include

- Development of ENT department into a full-fledged one with qualified ENT surgeon.
- · Commencement of an audiology clinic with all

- equipments and a trained full time audiologist which is especially useful in detecting hearing defects in newborn infants facilitating early intervention that adds to the quality of the child's life
- Opening of a Chronic Disease Clinic which regularly monitors patients suffering from Diabetes, Hypertension, Asthma/COPD, Epilepsy, Rheumatoid Arthritis, and Thyroid disease.

Sri Sathya Sai General Hospital, Whitefield

This 50 bed general hospital is associated with on a unique model of that involves significant volunteering by honorary doctors along with in-house doctors. Nearly 2015 surgeries were performed and more than 100,000 patients received treatment in the previous year.

A live international ENT workshop on Endoscopic ear surgery was conducted with close to about 100 delegates attending including and an expert team of doctors from Italy. A number of research papers published by doctors of the Obstetrics and Gynaecology were awarded recognition at various levels.

The gynaecology department upgraded its equipment to provide laparoscopic surgeries and diagnostics. Apart from regular surgeries, major laparoscopic surgeries are now being carried out at SSSGH WFD.

Sri Sathya Sai Mobile Hospital, Prasanthi Nilayam

Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba inaugurated in March 2006, Sri Sathya Sai Mobile Hospital that takes top quality secondary level healthcare right to the rural doorstep. A bus equipped with Ultra sonogram machine with Color Doppler, ECG and Haematology and Biochemistry Analysers visits villages in three mandals around Prasanthi Nilayam for 12 days a month. Over these 12 days a team of about 45 doctors across various specialities drawn from a pool of around 400 doctors volunteer their services. Each month nearly 400 villages are served and an average of 6000 patients treated.



Patients who need further medical attention are referred to the super-speciality hospitals or the general hospitals run by the Trust where volunteer surgeons serving with Sri Sathya Sai Mobile Hospital are also involved in performing surgeries for these patients. This had led to an increase in the number of surgeries of all specialties for the needy and greater voluntary involvement by reputed surgeons from all over Andhra Pradesh and Telangana.

A Chronic Disease Programme maintains a regular treatment protocol for patients with diseases like Diabetes, Hypertension, Epilepsy etc.

Sri Sathya Sai Telehealth Programme

Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Medical Sciences (SSSIHMS) at Whitefield, Bengaluru, Karnataka provided 1291 neurosurgery and 1040 cardiology tele-consultations for patients from the States of Odisha and West Bengal. Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Medical Sciences (SSSIHMS) at Prasanthigram, Puttaparthi, Andhra Pradesh provided 781 cardiac surgery and 52 cardiology tele-consultations for patients from the States of Madhya Pradesh, Odisha and West Bengal.



The curriculum ensures a right mix of academics, spirituaity, culture, sports and arts. The School has a healthy student-teacher ratio of 13:1 and has always maintained an excellent academic record.

Smt. Eswaramma High School (non-residential), provides modern and secular education, following the curriculum of CBSE, and nourishes the children with human values through its integral system of education.

Sri Sathya Sai Gurukulam English Medium School, Rajahmahendravaram

The School was instituted by Bhagavan Baba on the 23rd of June, 1981 and is affiliated to CISCE (Council For The Indian School Certificate Examinations), New Delhi. The campus spread over 23 acres, consists of 2 school buildings, 2 hostel buildings, prayer and dining facilities, an auditorium, a guest house, and a workers and management quarters.

Sri Sathya Sai Primary School, Delhi

Sri Sathya Sai Primary School (non-residential) was established in July 2012 for the under privileged children with classes from Nursery to 1st Standard. Today it is a full-fledged primary school up to class 5th. The mission of the school is to integrate human values as expounded by Bhagavan Baba, and quality education to all the students. For this, Bal Vikas classes are held every week to inculcate human values among the students.

Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Learning

The seed of Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Learning (SSSIHL) was planted way back in 1968, when Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba started the first women's college, to—in His own words—provide the youth with an education which, while cultivating their intelligence, will also purify their impulses and emotions and equip them with the physical and mental disciplines needed for drawing upon the springs of calmness and joy that lie in their own hearts.

SSSIHL with its four campuses located in - Anantapur, Andhra Pradesh (Women), Prasanthi Nilayam, Andhra Pradesh (Men), Brindavan, Whitefield, Karnataka (Men), Muddenahalli, Karnataka (Men), fosters a modern Gurukula style environment, where many teachers stay in and help manage the student activities in the hostel and are available to the students 24/7 for any kind of help and support. To facilitate this model, the University has a compulsory residential policy for all students. Students with diverse cultures and varied economic backgrounds live in dormitory-styled accommodation with 10-14 students staying together in a room. Here they learn to adjust with one another and live together in harmony; and this diversity contributes to a rich and stimulating learning environment that brings out the best in students.

Highlights of Research at SSSIHL 2019-20:

- Finding solution for the excess fluoride content in the local ground water using green methods to achieve sustainable development.
- Address the problems faced by people at the bottom of the pyramid to augment their income levels being the primary objective.
- Blockchain technology use in cyber security in assisting the effective implementation of Central Government schemes.
- Predictive modelling for disease dynamics and control measures with diseases such as Dengue and Leprosy is also being taken up.
- Development of low-cost gamma camera and cost



effective multi modal microscope as effective diagnostic tools in the field of disease detection, Development of Low cost Optical Coherence Tomography (OCT) for non-invasive imaging methodology in Ophthalmology and Cardiology.

- Developing Chrondocyte cell culture for knee replacement surgeries
- Effective use of plant extracts for addressing the issue of malnutrition
- Development of functional foods and nutraceuticals like edible straw and Indian red beverage mix

COVID Research:

- Exploring herbal medicine of Curcumin to address the COVID infection by using the Curcumin nanoparticles which range from 10 to 100 microns so that it is absorbed in the intestines and is available in the blood for taking care of the Corona virus and eliminate it.
- In vivo Mathematical modelling of the COVID-19 viral infection



The Sri Sathya Sai Media Centre began its journey as Radio Sai Global Harmony, a satellite radio service in 2001 when Bhagawan launched it during His birthday celebration.

When Bhagawan inaugurated the studio facility of Radio Sai in 2002, He clearly explained that there is nothing for Him to gain through a media outreach unit; He was pleased as long as devotees are served. He had given a simple formula - when knowledge is used for the benefit of others, it becomes skill and it brings balance and insight.

Services Offered

The bouquet of services being offered include:

- Six 24/7 audio streams.
- Daily live audio broadcasts of prayer sessions from Prasanthi Nilayam.
- Every Thursday, day-long live audio shows from the studio focused on various aspects of Bhagawan's life and mission.
- "Sri Sathya Sai Official" YouTube channel delivering variety of video productions in English.
- "Sri Sathya Sai Bhajans" YouTube channel dedicated to the dissemination of Sai Bhajans.
- "Sri Sathya Sai Sandesha Jhari" YouTube channel dedicated to Telugu video productions.
- "Sri Sathya Sai Premvani" YouTube channel dedicated to Hindi video productions.
- A daily inspirational email service called Sai Inspires which takes Bhagawan's message and updates about Prasanthi Nilayam to over 100,000 people every day.

In Jan 2020, the Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust initiated the process to upgrade the facilities of this institution to a state-of-the-art Video, Audio and Broadcast studios.

Some of the new initiatives taken up during the year 2019-20 include:

This was to fill the numeracy and literacy gaps between rural and urban children, while giving them a chance to develop a sound character. To achieve this end, He set up SSSVV as the digital platform at www.srisathyasaividyavahini.org

Currently available SSSVV content includes comprehensive Master Lesson Plans for Grades 1 to 9 in Science, Environmental Studies, Mathematics, Social Studies and English grammar. These lesson plans come enriched with attractive multimedia, activity based learning and most importantly, human values integration.

Since 2019, over 1200 Master Lesson plans and nearly 10,000 digital assets have been created and uploaded to the portal.

In 2019, SSSVV was invited to New Delhi by the education vertical of the NITI Aayog, the Govt of India's think tank, to present the highlights of VV.

Soon after, at the request of the NITI (National Institution for Transforming India), two districts were selected for piloting the VV project in their government schools.


Recently SSSVV completed its first year of successful implementation with the government schools of Virudhunagar district in Tamil Nadu and the feedback is overwhelmingly positive.

Programmes conducted in the year 2019-20
